Phonics	We will be concentrating on common exception words again this week. For today, we would like you to practise writing the following words: school, parents, today Write them three times and then put them into sentences.																
English	Today, we will be thinking about alliteration. This is where two or more words start with the same sound, such as Plop has very knackety knees or twitchy toes. Some more examples of alliteration are: Ten terrible tigers tore Tony's teddy! OR Seven snapping sharks swim in the sea. We would like you to write some alliterative phrases (parts of a sentence) or whole sentences. If you would like to challenge yourself, try to link them to the story of Plop.
