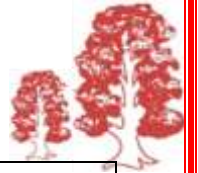



| <p>Daily Reading</p> | <p>Choose a book to read from <i>Your Stuff</i> on Bug Club every day. Please make sure you complete all the Bug Challenges. Once you have completed a challenge, the bug will close its eyes.</p>  |
| <p>Phonics</p> | <p>We will be concentrating on common exception words again this week. For today, we would like you to practise writing the following words: climb, clothes, cold Write them three times and then put them into sentences.</p> |
| <p>English</p> | <p>Jill Tomlinson, who wrote <i>The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark</i>, has written lots of other stories about animals. Here are some examples: <i>The Cat who Wanted to go Home</i>, <i>The Otter Who Wanted to Know</i>, <i>The Hen Who Wouldn't Give Up</i>, <i>The Aardvark Who Wasn't Sure</i>, <i>The Gorilla Who Wanted to Grow Up</i> and <i>The Penguin Who Wanted to Find Out</i>. We would like you to plan a story about an animal who might be scared of something, such as a cow who is afraid of grass or a bird who is afraid of trees or a worm who is scared of going underground! Plan your story today, including the animal, its name, what it is scared of and who it might meet.</p> |
| <p>Maths</p> | <p>Today we will be sorting 3D shapes Discuss with an adult the different ways we can sort 3D shapes> We can use our knowledge of shape properties to sort 3-D shapes in different ways e.g., faces, shapes of faces, edges, vertices, if they roll, if they stack... Use a variety of household objects to sort them in different ways. Work with an adult How have you sorted your shapes? How do you know you have sorted your shapes correctly? Which method have you used to sort your shapes? Can you sort your shapes in a different way? Can your adult guess how you have sorted them? Can you group your solids by shape, type of faces and size? You could try to create a Venn diagram like Jack's to show which shapes roll or stack then those which can roll and stack.</p>  <p>If you have access to the website complete the White Rose sheet for today.</p> |
| <p>Topic</p> | <p>This week in Design and Technology we would like to explore the taste and texture of dippers. If you are able to, taste a variety of dippers - pepper, cucumber, carrot, nachos, pitta bread, crackers - then use your senses to describe the smell, taste and texture. You can use Greek or natural yogurt to test the dippers. Which dipper is your favourite and why?</p> |
