Daily Reading	<p>Choose a book to read from <i>Your Stuff</i> on Bug Club <b>every day</b>. Please make sure you complete all the Bug Challenges. Once you have completed a challenge, the bug will close its eyes.</p>   
Phonics	<p>This week, we will be concentrating on common exception words. For today, we would like you to practise writing the following words: because, everybody, children Write them three times and then put them into sentences.</p>
English	<p>For the next two weeks, we will be reading <i>The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark</i> by Jill Tomlinson. There are two versions of this - the chapter book and the picture book. For example, cherry becomes cherries and baby becomes babies. Write a list of as many words as you can which change like this when they become a plural. Choose some to write sentences with.</p>
Maths	<p>2D and 3D shapes Watch the video <a href="https://vimeo.com/506145944">https://vimeo.com/506145944</a> Tell an adult what the difference is between 2-D and 3-D shapes. Can you draw 2D shapes? Play a game of 'What shape is this?' by describing a shape to an adult. Write down the names of the shapes. Have a look around your house for 2D and 3D shapes. Create a tally of the shapes you see. Can you see any pentagons? Can you see any octagons? Can you see any hexagons? RE	<p>We are starting our RE unit this term on 'Special Stories' by talking about stories or books that are important to us or our family. These might be favourite children's stories, books in a home language or books which have been given to you or a family member by someone special. Talk about your special books and think about why they are special to you.</p>
History	<p>This week in history we are learning about significant people. Discuss with an adult what makes someone an important person. Make a list of important people you have heard of. Can you choose one of these people and find out a bit more about them? When did they live? What did they do to become famous/important?</p>
