



# Year 2 Medium Term Plan - Geography (Navigation) - Spring

## Knowledge

To know where Kenya is in relation to the UK.  
 To know some differences between the UK and Kenya.  
 Begin to follow a simple journey line using key vocabulary.  
 To identify some physical and human features in Kenya.  
 To name and locate some features on a map of Kenya.

## Curriculum

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical and human features.  
 Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify countries, continents and oceans.  
 Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the UK and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country.  
 Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map.

## Skills

Use an atlas to locate different countries in the world.  
 Use and follow simple compass directions (NESW)  
 Follow routes on a map.  
 Use aerial photographs and satellite images to recognise basic human and physical features.  
 Make a comparison of two contrasting countries.  
 Describe the location of features on a map.
