# POETRY BY HEART

Choose a poem • Learn it by heart • Perform it out loud

We are launching our new event, 'Poetry by Heart.' This is part of our ongoing focus on children's oracy development for speaking aloud to an audience and performance skills.

We're celebrating poetry as part of Michael Rosen Day on Thursday 13th November and we're going to do this by having a schoolwide poetry event.

Each child will choose a poem, learn it by heart, and perform it out loud. This will happen in class, with two from each class being selected to go through to a year group 'semi-final'. From that group, two children will be selected to go through to the **'Grand Final' on Thursday 13th November in our school assembly.**

Here are the key dates:

## Friday 24 Oct

Home learning task for all children to learn a poem by heart. The home learning task will be for the week of half term and the week after, until Thursday 13th November. The theme is, 'Funny Food.'

You will receive an update sheet from your child's year group only for these weeks.

## Monday 3 – Wednesday 5 November

Please continue to encourage your child at home. You might want to model some poetry reading or use YouTube clips to hear from published poets (or children performing poetry).

## Thursday 6 - Tuesday 11 November

Each child performs to the class. Two children will be selected to go through to the year group final. Your child can still practise with y at home. Their teacher will let them know which day they are performing.

## Wednesday 12 Nov - morning

Year Group finals take place. Two children chosen per class will go through to 'Grand Final'.

## Thursday 13 November

Grand Final. 2.30pm whole school assembly Reception/ KS1. Two finalists from each class will perform to the school.

Nursery will also take part. Their 'Grand Final' will take place in the Nursery.

On this occasion, we will be holding the Grand Final in school only and will not be inviting parents and carers to attend. This will give the children a wonderful opportunity to showcase their skills and confidence in front of a familiar school audience.

They have already done an amazing job sharing their learning with you, and we're so proud of all they have achieved!

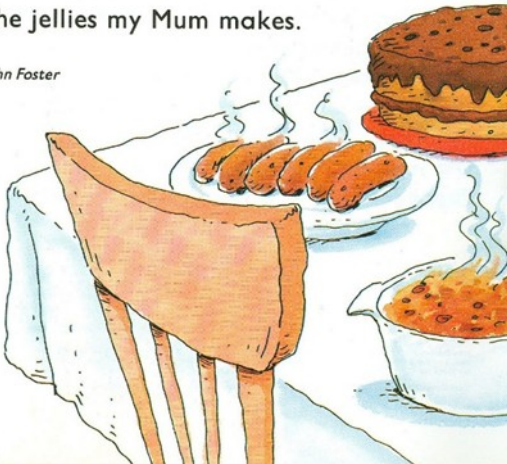

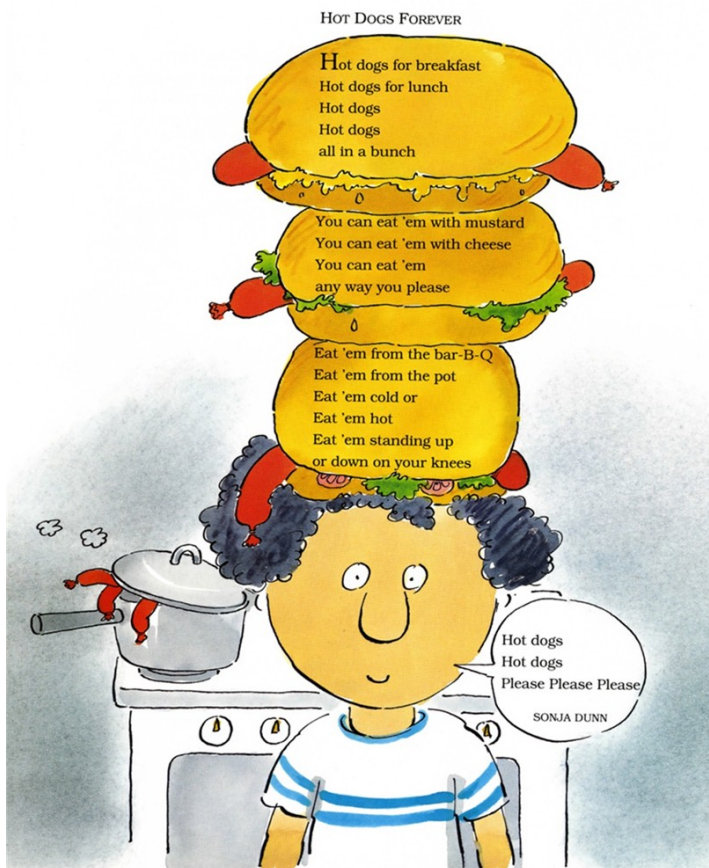
I pour in some flour

## Join our Elmtree Family and Friends (EFF)

### *We are looking for volunteers to lead our EFF*

A **Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)** plays a vital role in fostering a strong partnership between parents and teachers, which directly benefits children's education and well-being. A PTA is important for several reasons:

- 1. Enhancing communication between home and school.** The PTA acts as a bridge between parents and teachers. It provides a platform for you to communicate with us, share concerns, and stay informed about what's happening in the classroom and school-wide. This ongoing dialogue helps you understand your child's educational experience better and ensures that we are aware of any issues or needs at home.
- 2. Promotes parental involvement and engagement.** Active participation in the PTA encourages you to take an active role in your child's education. When you are engaged with us, your children tend to perform better academically and socially. Being involved also gives you an opportunity to learn more about educational strategies, resources, and events that may benefit your child.
- 3. Supports school improvement.** Through the PTA, you can voice your opinions, provide feedback, and collaborate with the us to improve educational practices and school policies. You can advocate for changes or support initiatives that will help enhance the quality of education and create a positive environment for your children.
- 4. Strengthens the school community.** A PTA brings together parents, teachers, and school staff to work towards common goals. This sense of community fosters a cooperative and supportive atmosphere in which everyone is invested in the success of our children. It also creates opportunities for social interactions, making our school environment feel more welcoming and connected.
- 5. Organises events and fundraisers.** PTAs often organise school events, fundraisers, and other extracurricular activities that enrich our children's learning experiences. These events can range from educational workshops to family nights and disco's. Fundraising efforts are particularly important as they help provide resources for school programs, classroom supplies, technology, and extracurricular activities that may not be covered by our regular budget.

*If we do not have a PTA then things like Bedtime Stories, the school disco, summer fair, Christmas festive fun and some of our curriculum resources would not be funded and we could not run these events, meaning the children would miss out on a whole host of enriching opportunities.*

- 6. Advocates for education and resources.** PTAs often engage in advocacy efforts on behalf of students, advocating for better funding, educational policies, and community

resources. They help ensure that we have the necessary resources to meet the diverse needs of children, from academic support to social-emotional learning resources.

*This year the EFF has funded our sensory toys and resources for each classroom and other areas around our school.*

**7. Creates a sense of belonging.** When you are involved in the PTA you feel more connected to us and our mission. It creates a shared sense of purpose and a community where you can feel proud of your involvement and the difference, they you making. This can help increase your satisfaction with your child's education and your relationship with us.

**8. Fosters success.** Research shows that when parents are engaged in their child's school life, pupils are more likely to do well academically, have higher self-esteem, and exhibit positive behaviour. PTAs provide a way for you to stay connected to us and support your child's academic and personal growth.

*The EFF (PTA) is not just a place for you to volunteer your time; it's an essential organisation that strengthens the relationship between home and school, provides support for the school's needs, and ensures that all children have the resources and opportunities to succeed. By joining and participating in the EFF, YOU can have a direct, positive impact on your child's education and the school community as a whole.*

We are entering a new phase of leadership for our EFF as parents of our previous Year 2 children move on. If YOU would like to join our remarkable EFF then please do email the school office or come and see us.
